
With the winner and runners up in my Christmas Card competition

The Alverstoke Christmas Tree Festival is always a favourite with my own children.

I invited children from schools across the constituency to submit a design for my 2014 Christmas card. Maia from Crofton Hammond Infant School was crowned overall winner and I visited local schools to meet her and the runners up. I also paid a visit to the Royal Mail sorting office in Gosport to pass on my thanks to the men and women who ensure that our festive cards and packages reach us safely.

Having abseiled off the Spinnaker Tower in aid of the Fareham & Gosport branch of the MS Society, I was thrilled to attend its Christmas Fayre and present representatives with a cheque for the £800 I raised. This month we celebrated the second Small Business Saturday which encourages people to 'shop small' & support our fantastic independent retailers. I managed to visit lots of small businesses across the constituency and do most of my Christmas shopping. This initiative is a reminder of the Government's commitment to support small businesses. In the Chancellor's Autumn Statement, he announced that Small Business Rate Relief would be extended and the discount for high street shops and cafes will increase to £1,500.



Infrastructure improvements are crucial to this growth so I met the roads Minister, Robert Goodwill MP to ask him to support the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership's £30M funding bid to complete a new access road to our peninsular. The decision will be announced in the New Year – fingers and toes firmly crossed! I also met with the Minister responsible for local bus services, Baroness Kramer, along with Hill Head residents, to discuss the adverse changes to bus provision across our area.

Alverstoke residents will be aware of the longstanding campaign to open up the Stokesmead site for public use. Finally, this month the Chief Executive of Gosport Borough Council, the Chair of Anglesey Conservation Group and I were able to sit down with the Managing Director and Executive Chairman of Abbey Homes which owns the land. It was an open and positive meeting which has laid the foundations for further discussions in the hope of finding an acceptable way forward.

This time last year some homes in Stubbington faced the threat of flooding. I brought together local residents and the key agencies involved for a meeting at Fareham Borough Council to discuss how these vulnerabilities can be mitigated against in the future.





Energy Bills can be a big worry at this time of year so I spoke to representatives from the Home Heat Helpline about how to keep the bills down this winter; you can call 0800 33 66 99 free from 9am to 5:30pm Monday to Friday to receive support.

The end of the year is always a good time to celebrate the year's achievements; I joined Alverstoke Bowling Club for their annual presentation and attended the Goshawks Gymnastics Awards. My sons and I also thoroughly enjoyed watching the Gosport Ice Skating Show; we were extremely impressed with the talented skaters of all ages.

I visited the Forces Families Club at HMS Collingwood and met some of the delightful children and parents who make use of the crèche facilities – clubs

such as these, run by an amazing team of dedicated volunteers, have a huge sense of camaraderie and offer important support to the families of service personnel. You can find out more about it here: Forcesfamiliesclub.co.uk.

This month, the Department of Health announced more details about the Independent Panel which has been launched to investigate the unexpected deaths at Gosport War Memorial Hospital during the 1990s. For all those involved, from bereaved families to hospital staff, this has been an extremely long and difficult journey so this is a welcome step towards closure.
