It's been a hectic October, jam-packed with community events and lots of activity, in both the Gosport Constituency and Westminster, on important local issues.

I was deeply concerned when the Care Quality Commission rated Queen Alexandra hospital's A&E department as 'requiring improvement' back in June. That's why I met with the new interim chief executive of QA, Tim Powell, this month. Recent well-reported incidents of ambulances queueing outside A&E for hours show that more must be done, particularly as we move into the high-pressure winter period. Therefore, I followed up my meeting with a letter to Tim & will continue to monitor the situation. You can see me talking about this issue, here.

A big part of the solution to this problem at QA is improving primary care in the community. This means faster access to GP services, so less people need take their healthcare issues to hospital in the first-place. In Gosport, the innovative Better Local Care (BLC) vanguard aims to do just this.

I was pleased to welcome the local GPs who head the BLC pilot and Gosport Same Day Access Service to Parliament. I took them to meet the Health Minister to discuss obstacles they are facing in moving the service forward.

Continuing on the health theme, I attended Westminster Flu Day, to promote the importance of getting this season's flu vaccine. 53% of at-risk people and 27% of people over the age of 65 in Gosport were not vaccinated last year. I would encourage anyone in at risk groups to take advantage of the flu vaccine, which is free for many groups including people like me who suffer with asthma.

Also in Parliament, I attended a Getting Ready for Winter event with British Gas to learn about how constituents can take advantage of free help and support with energy bills. Find out more, here.

In my role as Minister for Women & Equalities, I was honoured to be invited to open the London Stock Exchange and deliver a speech to senior employers in the financial sector about gender diversity, which is crucial for business success and the future of our economy.

In Gosport one of my favourite events of the year is HMS Sultan's annual Charity Cheque Presentation. I was delighted to once again be invited to help Captain Towell and his team award cheques to some of our outstanding local charities.

The success of Royal Clarence Yard's Heritage Open Days, prompted me to speak to bosses at Berkley Homes about how they can further support the regeneration and development of this local jewel. I visited the site this month to meet some of the great new businesses that have arrived there.

Julie and her team welcomed me to Arty's, a fantastic pizza restaurant that has relocated from Fareham Road . I was so impressed I decided to celebrate my birthday there this month! Next door, the Wendy House has just opened. As a cafe geared towards customers with children, I can see this being a great hit with local parents.

I visited the Victualler Harbourside Bar and Restaurant, another stylish and impressive new venue, which holds its launch party on Saturday, 5 November. I also popped to the re-opening of the Seahorse pub in Gomer. It is under the new management of the superstar sisters from the nearby Fighting Cocks, Sybille & Abby, and has a sumptuous looking seafood menu.

With such exciting venues opening up locally there's no longer any need to travel out of the peninsula for great food and of course, world class views!
